Appalachian Arts Program – Corn Husk Flowers

Appalachian Mountains native and lifelong artist Nora Mosrie finds inspiration in the natural world. Corn husks, which were used by Native Americans to create a variety of art forms and utilitarian objects, remain an important part of the Appalachian craft tradition. Your group can experience the art of making their own Appalachian craft by creating a corn husk flower to take home as a souvenir.*
